The Guest Speaker at the next meeting will be Cathy Harvey, a Missionary who conducts an Orphan School in Uganda.



The Guest Speaker: At the meeting was Cathy Smith, who is the Development Services Manager with Kurrajong Waratah. Cathy was introduced by our member Alan Davis, who is a Patron of Kurrajong Waratah

Cathy explained that Kurrajong was started by Bill & Annie Hurd in 1957, with the aim of assisting people with disabilities, and grew from assisting 79 in 1982 to 1153 in 2012 and covers an area which is 19% of the state.

Funding is by 47% from Government and 53% is self raised from donations and fund raising activities. They provide employment for 153 disabled persons, and have a staff of 180 full time, with 89 casuals.

They operate a recycling business which handles 680 semi trailer loads of compacted recyclables per year.

Kurrajong also operates a linen & laundry service in Narrandera, a coffee shop in West Wyalong, and as well operates a timber processing industry employing 24 disabled persons.

Kurrajong Waratah Early Intervention Centre assists 300 children.

Kurrajong e-waste recycling centre is operating in Chaston St. Wagga and recycles TV's for a nominal cost of \$8.00. If you have any unwanted TV's give them a call or drop them in.
