





Eileen is employed as a cancer care nurse by the Amie St Clair Melanoma Trust. The Trust was set up in memory of Amie, a passionate & prominent softball player, who became a victim of melanoma. Eileen is a clinical care nurse, one of only nine working in this position in Australia. She explained to members the work done by the Trust with its existence being entirely funded by local donations and fund raising events.





Eileen spoke with great conviction on the need to be sun wise, particularly those of us who have inherited the Celtic fair skin, which is so vulnerable to Australia's sun. On Tuesday September the 8th, a bus load of our members endured a slight drizzle during morning tea at Narrandera. Misty it was, but that didn't dampen our spirits.



OCTOBER GUEST SPEAKER CHRIS WILSON—RIVERINA BLUEBELL

Chris, on behalf of Riverina Bluebell, spoke passionately of the problems of many people who are suffering from one form of depression or another. Using his own experiences of 15 years where he was suffering depression so severe that he contemplated suicide, he finally accepted the help he needed at the insistence of his sister.

It was like I put a white flag up,' he says. 'I just can't do this anymore. I've got

to do something about it.' He recalls randomly flicking through the phone book looking for

psychologists. He still doesn't know why he chose the one he did. He called the number, spoke to the receptionist and booked in a session.

'I hung up the phone and turned around to my sister and I started crying.' 'I said, "you've just saved my life." She really did. I couldn't cope any longer. I was finished, I was done.

Now Wilson is prepared to share his story with anyone who asks. When he's not harvesting grain or feeding sheep, he spends his time sharing his experience with the Wagga Wagga community in the hope that other men struggling with their mental health will not wait 15 years to ask for help. riverinabluebell.org.au

NOVEMBER GUEST SPEAKER: DONNA GOODWIN

Donna gave an impassioned speech on the almost completed stage 2 of the Wagga Wagga Rural Referral Hospital. Acknowledging that most of us will still call it the Wagga Base Hospital, she pointed out the way in which the new name is relevant.

Using a display on the screen she went through, floor by floor, explaining the number of new beds and pieces of high tech equipment that is being installed.

She pointed out the modernisation of the patients rooms with ensuite facilities in all of them, which is vastly different to the rooms that have deteriorated over time in the, soon to be, old hospital.

With additional seven emergency treatment spaces (from 15 to 22) and eight

new Emergency Medical Unit beds. There are more operating theatres with lifesaving equipment

coronary care/high dependency unit (increase of eight beds).

She stated that there will be some equipment that can be moved from the current hospital but that it is all relatively new and that only some of what are recently purchased electric beds will be also transferred.

With state of the art equipment and a hoped for third stage of development still being considered, we have something to be proud of in our city.




