John Pottie has had eye surgery and will have his new eye fitted in a few weeks time.


Jeanette Carroll had an accident with a dog and was hospitalised. She is okay now.

We have been in self-isolation for quite some time. And it is really upsetting me to witness my wife standing at the living room window gazing aimlessly into space with tears running down her cheeks.





I have thought very hard about how I can cheer her up.



bike seven times on the way home.



Maureen Nugent is reported to be recovering well from her hip operation.


We think too, of all those who are battling sicknesses, particularly as we feel isolated during this COVOD 19 era.





I received a Thank You card from Laurel Macdonald following a Get Well Card sent when she was in hospital in January.


