Boyd Stone has had a stay in hospital and Joan had a health condition.


Alan Carroll hopes to be at our next meeting if he is able.

Rob's talk was based on Waggas Wagga preparation for growth. He spoke about the Pomingalarna Cycling Complex, Riverside Stage Three, Lord Baden Powell Drive, Jim Elphick Tennis Centre, the projected removal of the Croquet BBQ as the croquet club looks to being shifted to the Equex Centre. This area also

features the Bill Jacobs Athletics Centre and Rob referenced the granting of the Touch Carnival for a further three years, to name just a few assets that are taking place in the near future, or have already happened.

After his presentation Rob fielded a number of questions and also asked a few of his own as he enquired what members thought they would like to see improved, or added to, our city's features. Somebody questioned the proximity of the Riverside Recreation Area to the river and its being inundated by water. Rob replied that importantly it is where towns are built by a river you get the most requests for, and usage of, these types of facilities.
