

Hannah Sheeran who is a community consultation for the Murrumbidgee Primary Health Network. She spoke about how the Murrumbidgee community experience Palliative Care.

Palliative Care is directed at people with life threatening conditions. Most of us were unaware that Palliative Care operated in the home as part of the home care system as well as hospital care.

One can opt for Palliative Care in the home if one meets the criteria that one has a life threatening condition. Likewise people may be hospitalised and then leave hospital to be cared for at home using the Palliative Care resources.

Palliative Care in the home covers much of what the normal home care packages do not include. It helps with medications, life style problems, personal support and lots more.

The Home Care packages that we are more familiar with focus on home support such as cleaning, ironing, visits to the city, gardening, laundry and so on.

After answering several questions Hannah left material for members to take home and read.
